The Workshop Meeting was called to order with the pledge of allegiance and a moment of silence for the sick, handicapped, departed and military personnel of the community.

A motion was made to have an executive session regarding legal issues at 7:01 p.m.

A motion was made by B. Ghelarducci, seconded by W. Colussy authorizing Solicitor McDermott to file a notice of appeal before the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and Environmental Hearing Board for the order issued on April 4, 2014 regarding C-53-10. All in favor, motion carried 5-0.

VISITORS, PLEASE STATE NAME

Ms. Gilson stated that she has owned her property for almost 14 years and has never had a problem. There is a gentleman that has a Budget rent a car truck. Herself and the neighbors have tried to keep him from parking that truck between driveways. You cannot see when you start backing out of the pad. It is very dangerous. He has 3 vehicles and he will park one of them there to ensure a parking spot.

Manager Collins stated that she has had conversations with Chief King regarding the truck. We looked over the ordinances of what we can and are permitted to do. The issue is that there is no parking on the southerly side of the street. You are permitted to park on the northerly side. All of the ordinances prohibit you from blocking a driveway but they don't prohibit you

from blocking sight distance. Chief King is taking a closer look into this but as of now, he is parked legally.

Ms. Weise invited everyone to join her on Saturday, May 24th from 12:00 – 3:00 p.m. at the History Center and Triangle Park. We will have 4 to 6 World War II Jeeps that are all different. They all have different roles that they have played in WWII.

She also stated that she has a complaint about the crosswalks in Bridgeville.

Ms. Gilson stated that we have only 2 Bridgeville Day on the Avenue meetings left on May 7th and June 3rd. She needs volunteers to help.

Mr. Mizia stated that he is worried about Railroad Street and was wondering if the DEP said we couldn't touch it.

Manager Collins stated that where the C-53-10 is and beyond; there are a lot of more issues and until we get a plan together, they are monitoring everything. They are in charge.

Mr. Mizia and Council went into discussion about the concrete portion of Chess Hill.

He also stated that he wanted to make everyone aware of a young man that has been living in his white van since winter started on Patterson Avenue.

Mr. Palluch stated that the parks look beautiful. He also stated that underneath the Railroad trestle when it rains, the water builds up and people have to go onto the road to get around it.

Manager Collins stated that she is going to speak to the Railroad. The sidewalk belongs to them and I also want to speak to them about the condition of the trestle.

Mr. Ghelarduuci stated that they are still delivering the military banners.

Mr. Tolmer stated that the Workshop meeting will be held right before the Council meetings at 6:00 p.m. beginning in June.

L. Calabro stated that the Farmer's Market will be open on Tuesday, June 17th and was wondering if the Borough can sponsor \$100.00 to the Farmers Market.

Council stated that they will.

Mayor DeBlasio questioned the placement of the banners?

Manager Collins stated that they will be placed on the street and telephone poles on Washington Avenue first and then they will go onto the new poles on Railroad Street and then onto Station Street and Bank Street. They will circulate each year on Washington Avenue.

A motion to adjourn was made by B. Ghelarducci, seconded by M. Tolmer. Motion carried 5-0.
